We facilitated and hosted 12 in-person events in New York City and Chicago combined, positively impacting nearly 1,000 veterans. In addition, we are expanding our veteran engagement initiativesto the west coast next year, beginning with an event in San Diego, California, in the spring.

AMERIVET SECURITIES 2022 HIGHLIGHTS

- Our current staff is made up of **more than 50%** military veterans. In addition, our staff is approximately **30%** minorities and **20%** women.
- We participated in more than **35** events and sponsored **20** events.
- We added five full time employees to our team, two of whom are military veterans.
- Our firm welcomed six military veteran interns, including our first all-women veteran cohort.
- We partnered with the Chicago Summer Business Institute (CSBI), an internship program for underserved students in the Chicagoland area and hosted our first CSBI intern.
- We collaborated with seven veteran-owned companies, including one new company, Jus Sandwiches, based out of Chicago.

Our team facilitated and hosted 12 in-person events in New York City and Chicago, impacting nearly 1,000 veterans.













Our employees volunteered a combined total of **200** hours.

Internship Program and Hiring

This fall, we welcomed our first all-women veteran internship cohort:

- <u>Jing Qu</u> currently serves in the U.S Army Reserves and earned her undergraduate degree at Qingdao University. She took her CFA Level II exam during her time at our firm.
- <u>Cassidy Kelly</u> is a U.S. Army veteran and earned her undergraduate degree at the University
 of Virginia. During her internship, she passed her FINRA Securities Industry Essentials (SIE),
 Series 79 and Series 63. Ms. Kelly accepted a full-time position with UBS, which will begin in
 January 2023.

Our internship program covers the cost of study materials and testing registration for interns who want to take the FINRA SIE and licensing exams. It is important for us to set our military veteran interns up for success and provide support if they decide to forge a career in financial services following the program.

We welcomed <u>Alexander Meyers</u> into our spring internship program on the Debt Capital Markets desk and his internship was extended throughout the summer and fall semesters, as an intern with Equity Capital Markets. Mr. Meyers is a U.S. Marine Corps veteran and is currently obtaining his bachelor's degree from Stony Brook University.

Since our internship program began in 2018, more than 30 of our military veteran interns have moved on to secure roles at financial services firms or pursue graduate-level degrees at institutions such as Harvard, NYU Stern School of Business and more.

This summer, we welcomed Yarissa Lazaro, our first intern from the Chicago Summer Business Institute (CSBI), formerly known as the Chicago Summer Finance Institute. Ms. Lazaro had the opportunity to rotate across our Debt and Equity Capital Markets, as well as Public Finance, and learned about financial services and the different lines of business at our firm.

We encourage our employees to invest in themselves through leadership and professional development, as it enhances engagement and performance, while inspiring others.

Ms. Elias, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran, was accepted into the Wharton School of Business Executive Master of Business Administration program at the University of Pennsylvania. She started the program in the spring of 2022 with a major in finance and graduates in the fall of 2024.



Ms. Covington, a U.S. Army veteran, concluded the <u>Stand-To Veteran Leadership Program</u> at the <u>George W. Bush Presidential Center</u> in October.



Ms. Covington was one of approximately 50 selected to attend the program, which included active-duty service members, veterans, and civilians from diverse backgrounds and sectors.



Throughout the five-month program, Ms.
Covington heard from a variety of nationally known and distinguished professionals, educators, and experts in veteran and military family transition issues. Her final project highlighted the many issues women veterans face and proposed solutions, which includes connecting them to roles in finance.

Jennifer McDonough, Associate, is currently a Commander in the U.S. Navy Reserve. Part of her professional development, as a Strategic Sealift Officer and a Wargame Analyst with the Joint Staff, includes a two-year Joint Professional Military Education course that focuses on the Theory of War, Ethics and National Security Strategy. The program prepares senior officers like Ms. McDonough to qualify for a Joint Service Officer designation and empowers interoperability among the services. She began the 98-credit course in the fall of 2021 and graduates in the summer of 2023.



Education and Mentorship

In partnership with Signature Bank, our firm hosted approximately 40 participants from around the country in the First-Time Investor Program (F-TIP), a course designed to educate veterans about the financial tools available to help plan for their future.

The course educates veterans on the investment tools available to help them prepare for their financial future.

Veterans are almost twice as likely to have debt carried over from month-to-month than civilians. Additionally, 55% of veterans believe they are ill-prepared for a financial emergency.

Community Advocacy

We are proud to be a member of the Veterans on Wall Street (VOWS) consortium, which consists of more than 100 financial services firms and companies dedicated to providing opportunities to former and current military as they transition into the corporate workforce.

Ms. Elias, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran, served on the VOWS Executive Impressions Panel. She discussed the importance of diversity in financial services, provided advice to transitioning military servicemembers and shared her personal story of transitioning into finance.





VETS Indexes goal is to educate, equip, and prepare corporations to welcome veterans to their company. They hosted their semiannual conference this spring where Ms. Covington hosted a panel of women veterans and corporate professionals to discuss women veteran unemployment and underemployment.

Mr. Fitzgerald served on a VOWS panel to share insights on diversity and inclusion, and discussed the importance of hiring and retaining veterans.



Social Impact

Throughout 2022, AmeriVet provided support on multiple issues impacting veterans and their families. Our team provided financial sponsorships, hosted events and volunteered with organizations that directly impact the veteran community. This included organizations that address veteran homelessness, mental health and military children, as well as women and minority veterans.

Veteran-Owned Businesses

As a veteran-owned firm, we take pride in working with entrepreneurs and organizations that support veteran businesses. One of our goals is to ensure we are giving back to our community

by partnering with these entities.

As we expanded our outreach in the Chicagoland area and continued to utilize local veteran-owned businesses at our events. We partnered with the Chicago Fireboat Tours for the second year in a row to host the Semper Fi Fund's pre-Chicago Marathon lunch. Additionally, we started two new partnerships with Jus Sandwiches, a black women veteran-owned catering company from the south side of Chicago. We also partnered with Veteran Roasters, a veteran-owned coffee roasting company that hires at-risk veterans.



Last year, we began utilizing <u>Milk Money Kitchens</u>, a minority woman veteran-owned shared commercial kitchen space in Manhattan that provides opportunities for food businesses to launch and grow their brands. This spring, we utilized <u>Talea Beer Company</u>, a woman veteran-owned brewery based out of Brooklyn, NY, to provide refreshments at the events hosted in our New York office.

We partnered with <u>Government Content</u> once again to <u>create a video</u> highlighting AmeriVet's key leaders, their diverse backgrounds and their dedication to the veteran community. Government Content was founded by a 2005 West Point graduate and the organization is made up of military veterans with a passionate focus on storytelling.
